New Blossoms: SUPERFOODS

Beginning in Fall 2012 the Abbey expanded our culinary arts horizons with the introduction of the SuperFoods Program, bringing a new kind of nourishment into our repertoire. Made possible in part by City of Seattle Department of Neighborhoods Matching Fund grant. We began this grow your brain on the arts (and fuel it with healthy "super foods") featuring FREE food classes and events including music, visual arts, dance and great community based learning with neighbors and new friends. The cooking/arts class has been a hit, bringing in a hearty healthy group of cooks and eaters to focus on discovering new foods and finding fun, easy ways to involve "super foods" into healthy and organic meals.

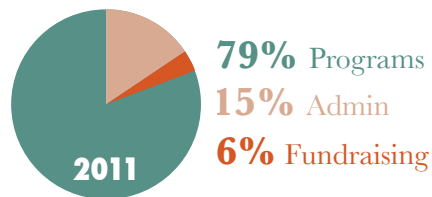
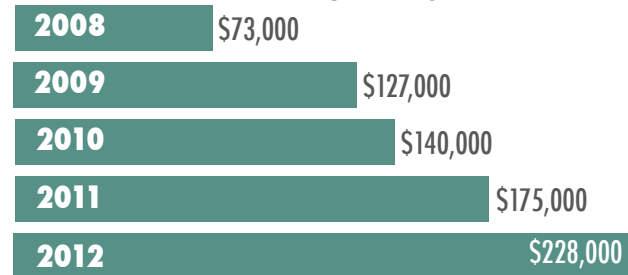
